Calciopoli

It's the summer of 2006 and Fabio Cannavaro is lifting the World Cup in Berlin as the whole of Italy celebrates. However, just a month later, celebrations would turn to shock. It was *Calciopoli*.

Calciopoli came to light when people discovered information through phone calls. These calls revealed that team leaders and referees were collaborating to cheat in games, giving a negative impression to Serie A, Italy's top soccer league.

Juventus faced the most severe consequences. They were relegated to Serie B, deducted 9 points, and had to return two titles. Other teams like AC Milan, Lazio, Reggina and Fiorentina also received penalties, including points deductions and financial fines. Leaders and referees were banned from participating in football.

The scandal created significant issues for Italian football. Juventus experienced financial difficulties, and talented players left the team. The global perception of Italian soccer, and people lost trust in the systems that governed the game.

Following *Calciopoli*, the Italian Football Federation (FIGC) implemented changes to improve the situation. They aimed for more honesty and took measures to prevent similar misconduct. Juventus worked diligently to return to Serie A and perform well in European competitions.
